GLUTEN-FREE FOOD PRESCRIPTIONS

NHS Dorset are ending prescriptions of gluten-free food for those with coeliac disease in the county. This decision has been made after a public survey, and brings us inline with national guidance.


Key factors in this decision were that glutenfree foods are now more widely available in shops, both physical and online, due to greater awareness and demand, and that the cost of gluten-free foods available on prescription can be higher than those available in supermarkets and online. SHINGLES EXPANSION

From 1st September, more people will be eligible for a vaccination against shingles. Currently, the vaccine is available to anyone aged 65, 70-79, or over 50 if you have a weakened immune system (known as immunocompromised). Going forward, this last cohort is being extended to include those aged over 18 who are immunocompromised.

If you're eligible, you will be invited to receive your vaccination by your surgery after your eligibility has been verified by a GP.

PARACETAMOL IN PREGNANCY

Recent comments by political figures in the USA have made headlines for suggesting a link between taking Tylenol during pregnancy and the development of autism in children. Tylenol is a brand of drugs available outside of the UK, in which the active ingredient is paracetamol.

The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Authority (MHRA) has confirmed **taking paracetamol during pregnancy remains safe** and there is **no evidence it causes autism in children**.

Paracetamol is recommended the first-choice painkiller for pregnant women. Patients should not stop taking their pain medicines as untreated pain and fever can pose risks to the unborn child.

The MHRA regularly reviews the safety of paracetamol during pregnancy to ensure that the benefits to the patient and unborn baby outweigh any risks.





Patients not turning up for appointments are a massive drain on resources across the NHS. While sometimes there are valid reasons why you may be unable to make your appointment, please call and let us know if you can.

HEALTH COACHING REFERRALS

Health and wellbeing coaching has been provided to our surgeries by Help & Care, an organisation that can support GP surgeries with certain non-clinical staff such as social prescribers and health coaches. Following a data review, we have made the decision to no longer directly refer patients to Help &



Care. However, we do encourage those who would benefit from health coaching to self-refer via the Help & Care website. By self-referring, you have control over your own referral, and are likely to be seen sooner. Plus, there's still no charge for their services!

The figures presented in this newsletter are taken between 1st April 2024 and 31st March 2025, and are gathered from the NHS Digital GP Appointments Dashboard.

WELCOME TO SYSTMCONNECT!

Patients at the Panton Practice, Moordown Medical Centre, and St Albans Medical Centre may have noticed a change in how you fill out an online consultation. These practices have joined James Fisher Medical Centre in replacing our previous provider, known as eConsult, with SystmConnect. This is a service that allows you to get in contact with your surgery without having to call or come in.

SystmConnect should be quicker and easier to use for patients, and by submitting a SystmConnect request you're helping keep phone lines available for those without online access. If you need to contact your surgery about a non-urgent new or existing condition, request a Fit note, or make a medication request, you can give it a try by visiting your practice's website and following the link. Take a look below to know what to expect.

All methods of contacting your surgery are treated equally, with requests being triaged by a professional according to clinical need.

Have your say about your surgery - sign up for our bi-monthly Patient Participation Group (PPG) on your Practice's website to provide constructive feedback on how we're doing. The group usually meets on the first Tuesday of every other month from 6pm at East Way Clinic. The next meeting is 6th January.
